Ulighed i sundhed: Hvad betyder opvækstvilkår for unges risiko for depressive symptomer og overvægt?

Der er tale om komplekse forhold, når vi ser på sammenhængen mellem børns opvækst og deres senere trivsel, konkluderer et nyt ph.d.-projekt fra Aarhus Universitet, Health. Projektet er gennemført af Per Høgh Poulsen, der forsvarer det d. 06/03

"Det er alment kendt, at socioøkonomiske faktorer har betydning for børn og unges mentale og fysiske helbred. De bagvedliggende årsager til f.eks. overvægt og svær overvægt er dog meget komplekse.

Formålet med dette ph.d.-projekt var at undersøge de langsigtede konsekvenser ved at vokse op i social ulighed. Hvordan er sammenhængen mellem socioøkonomiske og psykosociale faktorer i barndommen og depressive symptomer og overvægt i ungdom og tidlig voksenalder?

Projektet er gennemført som en befolkningsundersøgelse blandt ca. 3.000 unge født i Vestjylland. Til grund for analyserne ligger både registeroplysninger og spørgeskemasvar fra de unge og deres forældre.

Projektets resultater kan måske være med til at tydeliggøre, hvilke psykosociale og helbredsmæssige faktorer, der kræver en særlig bevågenhed, når vi overvejer forebyggende tiltag i forhold til mentale og fysiske helbredsproblemer blandt børn og unge.

Ph.d.-projektet er gennemført af Per Høgh Poulsen, fysioterapeut og cand.sicent.san. ved Arbejdsmedicin, Regionshospitalet Herning og Institut for Klinisk Medicin, Aarhus Universitet.

Inequality in health: Childhood and the risk of depressive symptoms and overweight in young people

Matters are complex when it comes to the association between children's upbringing and their later well-being. This is the conclusion of a new PhD dissertation from Aarhus University, Health. The study was carried out by Per Høgh Poulsen, who is defending his dissertation on 06/03.

It is well known that socioeconomic factors influence the mental and physical health of children and adolescents. The underlying reasons behind for instance overweight and obesity are, however, very complex.

The aim of this PhD study was to examine the longterm consequences of growing up in a context of social inequality. What is the association between socioeconomic and psychosocial factors in childhood and depressive symptoms and overweight in youth and early adulthood?

The study has been conducted as a population study among 3.000 young people born in West Jutland. The analyses are based on register data and questionnaire responses from the young people and their parents.

The results may highlight psychosocial and health-related factors which need special attention when considering preventive initiatives related to mental and physical health problems in children and young people.

The PhD study was taken out by Per Høgh Poulsen, physiotherapist and MSc in Health Science at Dept. of Occupational Medicine, research clinic, Regional Hospital Herning and Department of Clinical Medicine, Aarhus University.
